General Winter Prep Safety Tips





Plan for Weather

Regularly check weather forecasts

Stock up on non-perishable food and water

Keep cell phones charged

Keep shovels and salt/sand handy for clearing snow or icy walkways

Invest in a generator for when the power goes out

Prepare Your Car

Check your tire treads, install snow or all-terrain tires

Check and refill antifreeze and windshield washer fluid

Keep an emergency kit in case you get stranded. Include: first-aid kit, car phone charger, jumper cables, and flash light

Prepare Your Home

Check your heating system to ensure it's running properly

Make sure you have enough heating fuel if applicable (Maintenance)

Check and replace batteries in smoke detectors and CO alarms (Maintenance)

Insulate water line to avoid pipes freezing and/or bursting (Maintenance)

CHEF'S CORNER Kielbasa, Pierogis and Cabbage

Ingredients:

1 pkg. sliced cole slaw mix (no Mayo) 1 red onion cut thin 1-2 rounds of Hillshire kielbasa Box of frozen pierogis

Method:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Thaw pierogis on counter. In a skillet sauté onions ad cole slaw mix in olive oil until tender. Slice kielbasa into bite sized pieces. Layer oblong pan with slaw and onion mix, place kielbasa on top and pierogis on top of kielbasa. Drizzle with a little bit of olive oil on pierogis, cover with foil and bake for approximately 45 minutes, remove foil and return to oven until pierogis are a little brown.
