THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

Dec. 1, 1955—The birth of the modern American Civil Rights Movement occurred as Rosa Parks was arrested in Montgomery, Alabama, for refusing to give up her seat to a white man and move to the back.

Dec. 2, 1954—The US Senate condemned Senator Joseph McCarthy for misconduct following his ruthless investigation of thousands of alleged Communists.

Dec. 2, 1859—Abolitionist leader John Brown was executed for treason at Charles Town, West Virginia, following his raid on the U.S. Arsenal at Harper's Ferry.

Dec. 3, 1984—A deadly gas leak (of methyl isocyanate) at a Union Carbide plant in Bhopal, India killed at least 3000 persons and injured more than 200,000.

Dec. 5, 1791—Wolfang Amadeus Mozart died a pauper at age 35 in Vienna, Austria.

Dec. 6, 1877—At his laboratory in West Orange, New Jersey, Thomas Edison spoke the children's verse "Mary had a little Lamb...." while demonstrating his newly invented phonograph Dec. 7, 1941—Attack on Pearl Harbor. A day that will live in infamy.

Dec. 9, 1992—Buckingham Palace announced the separation of Prince Charles and Princess of Wales, Diana.

Dec. 10, 1950—Dr. Ralph Bunche became the first African American man awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, for his efforts in mediation between Israel and nearby Arab states the previous year.

Dec. 13, 1642—New Zealand was discovered by Dutch navigator Abel Tasman of the Dutch East India Company.

Dec. 15, 1890—Sioux leader Sitting Bull was killed in a skirmish with U.S. soldiers along the Grand River in South Dakota as his warriors tried to prevent his arrest.

Dec. 17, 1777—At Valley Forge in Pennsylvania, the Continental Army led by General George Washington settled in for the winter. Dec. 21—Winter begins in the Northern Hemisphere. In the Southern Hemisphere it is the beginning of Summer.

Dec. 23, 1888—Dutch painter Vincent Van Gogh cut off his left ear during a fit of depression.

Dec. 24, 1990—On Christmas Eve, the bells of St. Basil's Cathedral in Moscow rang for the first time since the death of Lenin. Dec. 26, 2004—An estimated 230,000 persons were killed and 1.5 million left homeless when a magnitude 9.3 earthquake on the seafloor of the Indian Ocean set off a series of giant Tsunami

waves that smashed into the shorelines of a dozen countries including Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Thailand, India and Somalia.

Dec. 31, 1879—Thomas Edison provided the first public demonstration of his electric incandescent lamp at his laboratory in Menlo Park, New Jersey.

PREVENT THE SPREAD OF GERMS!

<u>Wash Hands</u>: Washing your hands is the best way to avoid a cold. When germs are on our hands, they can easily make their way into our body when we touch our eyes or mouth. Be sure to wash before meals or preparing food and after you use the bathroom.

<u>Cover Nose and Mouth</u>: Cough or sneeze into a tissue or the crook of your elbow to avoid spreading germs to others. Try not to cough or sneeze into your hand as you'll just spread those germs to the next thing you touch.

Disinfect your Space: Use a disinfecting wipe to wipe down high-traffic spots in your home, especially if a family member is ill. These areas can include doorknobs, computers, phones, TV remotes, and light switches, among other things.

<u>Stay Home When Sick</u>: Going to work, school, or out in public when you are sick can risk getting others infected. Although you may be able to handle being sick, it might not be so easy for others with a weak immune system. Listen to your doctor and rest until you feel better!

Get your Flu Shot: Getting your flu shot will reduce your risk of getting the flu by 40-60 percent. This also reduces the risk of spreading infection to others. Flu season starts in October and ends in May with the peak activity between December and February.

CHEF'S CORNER



BLT SKILLET

4 ounces uncooked whole wheat linguine 4 bacon strips, cut into 1-1/2 inch pieces

1 plum tomato, cut into 1-inch pieces 1 garlic clove, minced

1-1/2 teaspoon lemon juice

Cook linguine. Meanwhile, in a large skillet, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp. Remove to paper towels; drain, reserving 1 teaspoon drippings.

In the drippings, saute tomato and garlic for 1-2 minutes or until heated through. Stir in the bacon, lemon juice, salt and pepper.

Drain linguine; add to the skillet. Sprinkle with cheese and parsley; toss to coat.
